

**Regular Meeting No. 2019-04-02-RG**

April 2, 2019 7:00 p.m.

The Town Council of Gurley, Alabama, met on April 2, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. in the Gurley Town Hall for a regular meeting.

Upon roll call, present were Bill Dear, Robert Winn, Robert Sentell, Gary Boyett, Dorothy Johnson and Andrew Whitten. Mayor Sentell declared a quorum and called the meeting to order.

A motion was made by Whitten, seconded by Boyett, to dispense with the reading and approve, as prepared, the Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on March 19, 2019. On voice vote, motion carried.

**Consent Agenda:**

- a) **Bills for Approval:** A motion was made by Boyett and seconded by Dear to approve the bills to be paid. Motion carried on voice vote.

**Presentation of Reports:**

- **Robert Sentell – Mayor** – Thanked the Police for the Quick Resolution of the events that occurred in the Town.
- **Bill Dear – Town Council Place 1-** Fork in the Road will be the Band for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration. Meet with Mr. Hall and Mayor Sentell regarding parcel around the cemetery. They reached an agreement of \$25,000 for approximately 2.8 acres. The money received for emergency graves will need to be remitted back to Mr. Hall.
- **Gary Boyett – Town Council Place 3** – American Planning Association Conference for the Planning Commission. Boyett made a motion to pay \$570.00 for 7 people to be attend the American Planning Association Conference, seconded by Whitten, Motion carried on voice vote.
- **Andrew Whitten – Town Council Place 5-** We need to do something about the Street Department Trucks.

**Department Reports:**

- **Police Department:** Individuals are under arrest in Michigan. Thank Sergeant Martin & Officer Landis for retrieving a large portion of the equipment. Officer Landis will start the Police Academy on April 29<sup>th</sup>. Discussed the lock for the back door to be fixed.
- **Town Administrator:** Working on a Permit & Inspection Pricing. Interviewed a building inspector. The footings for the signs should be installed this week. Would like to get a cabinet made to store the rolled-up blueprints around the office, estimated cost of \$385.00. Mayor Sentell said he could go forward with the cabinet. Programmed the new laptop with the ECHO Flow Monitoring System.
