The Town Council of Gurley, Alabama, met on December 15, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the Gurley Town Hall for a regular meeting.

Mayor Simpson called the meeting to order. Upon roll call, present were Bill Dear, Robert Winn, Gary Boyett, Joseph Belles, Andrew Whitten and Stan Simpson.

A motion was made by Whitten, seconded by Winn, to dispense with the reading and approve as prepared, the Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on December 1, 2020. On voice vote, motion carried.

Resolutions, Ordinances, Orders and other business:

- a) **Bills for Approval:** A motion was made by Whitten, seconded by Winn to pay the bills. Some discussion from Belles regarding using the credit card for some of these small items. Motion carried on voice vote.

- d) **Stephen Landis Compensation for 1033 Program:** A motion was made by Dear, seconded by Boyett to approve paying Stephen Landis \$15.00 per hour to prepare the inventory for the annual audit of the 1033 Program. This was discussed in detail. Motion carried on voice vote with Belles voting no.

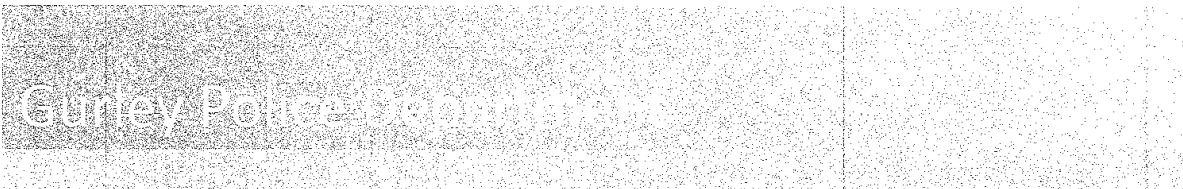
Report to Gurley Town council on December 14, 2020

Ongoing construction projects:

1. Commercial Building at 6625 Walker St. The large building has passed the foundation/footing inspection and the rough framing for the sides and roofing is in progress.
2. Residential home at 181 Robinson Road is in the final stages of completion, waiting for the final inspection this month.
3. Residential home at 201 Heritage View Circle has passed is foundation/footing inspection. Construction on the rough framing is in progress.
4. The Mt. Pisgah Church project is in the final stages of painting and clean up. They expect the request for the final inspection to be in January or February 2021.
5. The planned new home at 1080 Gurley Pike has not started as yet. Update to follow later this month.
6. The new residence at 890 Hereford Road has started the footing and foundation construction. The delays were due to the banks and survey delays due to the Covid-19 issues.
